# From the Pastor

## ‘Sometimes It Just Seems to Be Too Much’


During the first year in seminary, the school assigned me to a small group with whom I was to walk for the entire year. We met weekly. Ironically, I didn’t even make our first meeting because I had to travel home unexpectedly to mourn the passing of my then father-in-law. And yet, the group made space and welcomed me and were the support and care I needed. I’m still in contact with most of those folks.

Our group also experienced some overwhelming losses that year. I will never forget the day we learned that the clergy who was supporting our group was removed from the pulpit for sexual misconduct (and, as a consequence, from supporting our group). That day, in the pain we were experiencing, the professor who was also supporting our small group, came in with the balm of a prayer / poem by Ted Loder entitled “Sometimes It Just Seems to Be Too Much.”

I sit here on Thursday night (May 28) after having heard the news of the fires and riots and protesting in Minneapolis that sits atop my agony over the death of George Floyd and over and against the reality of over 100,000 Americans dying at the hands of this pandemic, with the same cry in my heart. Sometimes it just seems to be too much.

It is my prayer that the words of Loder’s poem will come to you as balm on these days when words fail us and sighs are even hard to come by.

## Process for re-opening Eden Prairie UMC, from page 1

- J **Through the summer of 2020 (Labor Day Weekend) there will be no in-person, in-building gatherings of any size.**
- J **For now, we are not planning for drive-in or outdoor worship,**
- J **A COVID 19 Task Force** will be empowered to shape our church’s response to changing conditions, especially related to our building use policies and procedures.
- J **A Technology Task Force** will be empowered to work toward a plan for continuing online worship availability as more in-person worship options become available to us.

Friends, we do not come to these decisions lightly. But we come to them from a place of faith. John Wesley gave us three simple rules of how to live as Methodist disciples of Jesus: ***first, do no harm; second, do good; third, stay in love with God.*** Our decisions to continue to be the community of faith from the safety of our own homes is based on the first rule – we do

not wish to do any harm to anyone by opening our building for in-person gatherings! I appreciate your prayerful support as we continue to navigate seasons and conditions we could never have imagined, while trying to do no harm, do good and stay in love with God.

***We have never closed the church.*** The building is not available for gatherings, but the church has never closed. ***We have been worshiping together, studying together, praying together, serving together and enjoying fellowship together in new and innovative ways. We will continue to be the church while we are not gathering in-person.*** While it is not ideal, we believe it is the most faithful decision to which we could come, knowing what we do right now. Thank you for all the ways you will stay engaged and keep our community of faith connected.

Since my stimulus money came in, I had more time to work. I prepped and painted the smooth walls of the narthex and columns in the sanctuary. This involved lots of taping and some patching.

I moved on to installing eight fire alarm pull station covers (to prevent alarms from being pulled accidentally). Six were screwed into concrete block walls, difficult task; one alarm had to be lowered so the cover would fit, very difficult. I called the alarm company BEFORE I installed the covers to save a visit from the Fire Department.

I reinstalled a metal shield around an outdoor cable, changed air filters in the rooftop HVAC above the office and cleaned out some roof drains.

One more painting job is a strip for hanging additional confirmation pictures. Four frames are ordered and will need painting when they arrive; we can then hang the photo of the 2019 class (and the 2020 class later this year.)

My family reunion will be on Zoom with 50-75 relatives; it should be interesting.

## Partnering with Simpson Housing Services



As a result of COVID 19 and our “safer at home” orders, volunteer activities have been temporarily cancelled at the Simpson Shelter. Simpson’s shelter was the first in the Twin Cities to extend its shelter hours to 24/7 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Currently, they are providing 66 shelter guests a safe space and a temporary home. Since the shelter remains open, the needs for food and other items to care for this vulnerable population still exist. To help us continue to support Simpson Shelter as they feed the folks who are staying with them, please make your donation at <http://www.prairichurch.org/online-giving> or the Give+ App (choosing “Simpson Shelter”), or mail a donation to the church indicating the gift is for Simpson Shelter. Our next scheduled serving date is Sept. 1, and we hope to either serve the meal or fully fund its purchase. It costs about \$400 to do this. Thanks for your ongoing attention to be a church that is “big enough to make a difference!”

## PROP’s 2020 Summer Needs

Although there have been significant changes in our world in the last few months, PROP’s mission to feed hungry families has not changed. As you can imagine, for many people who have lost jobs and have children at home full-time, their needs are greater than ever!



PROP’s administration is implementing programs to meet these new challenges. Here are five ways we at EPUMC can help.

1. **Donate through the EPUMC website;** select PROP from the drop-down menu.
2. **Donate \$25 gift cards from Target or Cub** to be given to families for supplemental needs or items PROP is unable to purchase at this time. Gift cards can be mailed to the PROP office at 14700 Martin Drive, Eden Prairie, 55344, or ordered online at Cub Foods or Target to have sent directly to PROP.
3. **Donate to the Summer Food for Kids Program through the Gift Match Challenge (See page 6)** which will double the impact of each monetary gift. Because of the need to purchase more of the food this year, the Gift Match Challenge will replace hands-on donations of previous summers. The Summer Food for Kids Program provides more than 800 school age children with healthy food such as fresh fruits and veggies, dairy items like cheese and yogurt, and other favorites such as peanut butter, jelly, and granola bars.
4. **Purchase an #InThisTogether EP yard sign** sold by the City of Eden Prairie through EP Liquor locations near Cub Foods or Kowalski’s. Signs cost \$10, \$3 of which will go to PROP. This is a way to show support to each other in our community as well as help PROP.
5. **Donate grocery items.** PROPS’s list of most needed items is on their website. Currently the list includes: 100% juice, crackers, razors, coffee, and pancake mix. PROP has Safe Donation Procedures in place: bring to PROP during business hours; stay in your vehicle and honk for service; wait for volunteer to come out to retrieve donations.
